Check for Leaks

Walk the entire surface to visually inspect while particularly searching for sagging, puddled water, cracks and places the roof isn't secure to walls or protrusions.

Remove Debris

Leaves are still falling and need to be cleared once trees are bare. Take time to remove branches, leaves, and other debris both from the roof surface and drains.

Watch for Mold

Clean and remove mold, mildew, and algae which can conceal underlying roof issues.

Ice Dams and Snow Removal

As we get into winter, watch for icicles which may signal ice dams. Ice can be especially damaging to a membrane. Experts note that packed snow in excess of a foot can cause damage to your roof so safely remove it.
