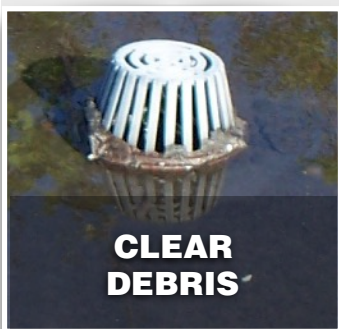


It's time for spring roof inspection and maintenance.

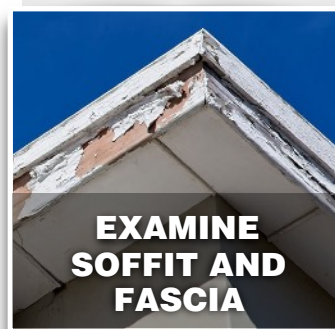
Be certain to do these each spring:

**1**

Branches, twigs, leaves, wrappers or other debris can be clogging drains, gutters or downspouts. If these are not removed, the humidity of summer creates the perfect environment for algae, moss, and mold to grow, especially in shady areas. Also watch for melting snow and ice dams which can cause water to pool.

**2**

Weakened limbs and low-hanging branches are roof hazards. Powerful spring and summer storms may cause them to fall on the roof. Nearby trees can also attract birds which can peck and damage roof materials. Birds have also been known to build nests on roofs.

**3**

These can be trickier to spot potential damage. Feel for soft spots and look for holes.

**4**

The underside of your roof is where you may find black spots, water stains, or other signs of moisture. The insulation should not have mold nor mildew. Any of these are clear signs of leaks and damage to the roof surface or structure. This is the time to call in a roofing contractor.
