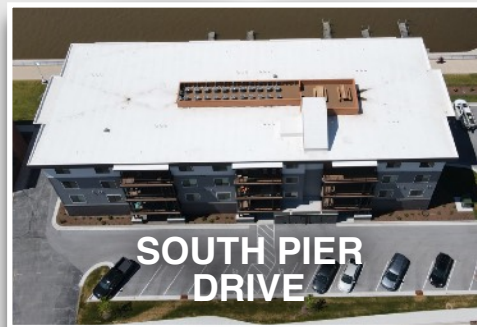


We've been busy while continuing to overcome the challenges of getting construction materials. Below are some of the buildings we've roofed recently. We're honored to work with these companies, and some for over 15 years, for all their roofing projects. These may get you thinking about how you can reroof portions of an expansive roof vs. making the commitment to the entire project at once. We also roof new construction buildings of all shapes and sizes.



Roofing the elevated separate areas of this combination apartments/retail building made it almost like doing four mini projects with a larger one. We covered the main 17,000-square foot roof of this new construction in two weeks but the entire project took over three months while waiting for other contractors.



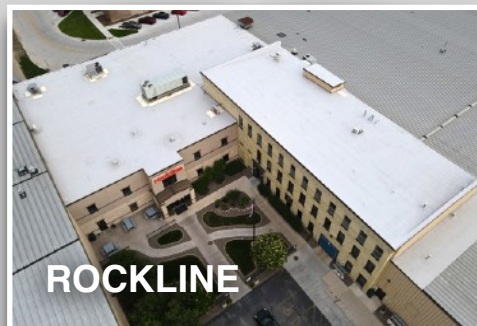
Multi-unit housing construction has seen tremendous growth in the past year with no signs of decreasing. This condo building had a single, central area of the roof to work around and it was in close proximity to the 7 Penn apartments so we were able to complete the projects simultaneously.



This very active manufacturing and distribution facility needed about half of the 200,000 square foot building reroofed this year and leaves only a quarter we haven't done yet. If you look closely, those small dots are seagulls resting on the smooth finish of the roof membrane.



Home to a health insurance company, the numerous protrusions combined with unique angles made for an interesting reroof. The entire 10,700 square foot project took about two weeks with a bit of extra time for protrusions.



For extremely large manufacturing facilities, we work with the building manager to develop a reroof schedule. We began with the corporate office area in June and will be reroofing about a quarter of the manufacturing area next month.



The 27,000-square foot corporate office area for this food service equipment manufacturer was reroofed this month. Off in the background is a beige area that we roofed in 2010.
